1. Welcome words by the Chair

The Chair congratulated **Farid Safi** (AAC Secretariat) for his recent wedding and **Leo Kirchmaier** (Austrian Fisheries and Aquaculture Association) for the birth of his twins. He also wished quick recovery to Javier Ojeda (AAC Chair) and excused **Marie-Christine Monfort** (from WSI, candidate for AAC membership) who could not attend the meeting.



2. Adoption of the agenda and approval of the last extraordinary GA minutes (31st January, 2019, Paris)

The agenda and the minutes of last meeting were adopted.

3. AAC membership: presentation of candidates, decision on group repartition and approval

In preamble, Cécile Fouquet read aloud the text of AAC Chair Javier Ojeda, calling to find consensus about the categorisation (between « sector organisations » and « other interest groups ») of new members.

Croatian Aquaculture Association (CAA)

Goran Markulin (CAA) presented the CAA – attached to the Croatian Chamber of Commerce. The association was founded in 2004 and gathers all companies involved in aquaculture production in Croatia. Since 2005, it has been a member of FEAP.

The CAA was approved as new AAC member among sector organisations.

Women in the Seafood Industry (WSI)

WSI could not be introduced due to the absence of its representative **Marie- Christine Monfort**.

A long debate took place, with the 60% thinking that this association should be allocated to the 40% group, and the 40% group having doubts about the positions of WSI in relation to the sector.

The 40% group threatened to leave the AAC if a vote was to take place, as they would consider it to be an imposition of the will of the sector organisations.

After a long debate, the GA decided that WSI would become a member of the AAC but that the decision on the categorisation was postponed.

4. Calendar for next year of AAC meetings

6. AAC 2019-2020

- Presentation and approval of the Work Programme for next year

The Chair pointed out that the EC received the draft WP and had no objection about it.

Some members commented the draft WP:



Pier Antonio Salvador (API) requested that the Secretariat centralises the information of all the events on Aquaculture happening in the EU.

Bernhard Feneis (COGECA) said that the WPs should be adapted to the EU agenda.

The Chair replied that steps have been taken in that sense, giving the example of the planned work on the next Strategic Guidelines of the EC for aquaculture. He agreed that the AAC must be able to spontaneously take up some topics that may arise.

Bruno Guillaumie (EMPA) considered useful to update the Recommendation adopted on the Control Regulation following the remarks that may come from the EP and Council.

The Chair agreed that the Recommendation on the Control Regulation can be sent to the new Fisheries Committee of the EP.

The WP was approved with a change of the name of title V which should now read "Point V: food security and safety".

- <u>Presentation and approval of the Budget for next year</u>

Cécile Fouquet (Secretariat) presented the draft budget for next year. Four Member States have committed to contribute to AAC functioning for next year: Spain, Germany, France and Finland. Some member organisations didn't renew their membership for next year.

The budget was adopted as presented.

7. AAC language policy

It was decided that past and future AAC recommendations would be translated into **French, Italian, Spanish and German**. In addition, it was decided that the recommendations be - if requested - also translated into **Greek and Polish** on a case by case basis. **The Chair** added that draft recommendations will be edited to ensure good quality of drafting.

Bruno Guillaumie (EMPA) reminded that translations were not only useful to the EC and Member States but also for members themselves, as they need to know what they actually vote for within the AAC.

8. Amendment proposal to the AAC Rules of Procedure and Statutes

Bruno Guillaumie (EMPA) suggested to provide for :

- 3 Vice-Chairs instead of 2 for increased representativity (1 from Finfish category, 1 from shellfish category, 1 from the other interest groups)
- the immediate shift to the vote by simple majority of present members in case of absence of quorum at the GA, instead of convening another GA one month later.

The Chair said it will be checked whether proposed changes to AAC Rules of



Procedures and Statutes are in accordance with Belgian Law.

9. Election of AAC Chair and two Vice-Chairs for next 3 years

Javier Ojeda (APROMAR) was re-elected AAC Chair for the period 2019-2022

Marc-Philip Buckhout (Seas at Risk) was re-elected AAC 1st Vice-Chair for the period 2019-2022.

Addy Risseeuw (PO Mosselcultuur) was elected AAC 2nd Vice-Chair

10. Election of AAC Treasurer

Addy Risseeuw (PO Mosselcultuur) was elected as Treasurer.

11. AAC achievements in 2018-2019

Farid Safi (Secretariat) presented the achievements of the AAC in 2018-2019: fruitful meetings, several Focus Groups active, 5 adopted Recommendations, organisation of a workshop in Lisbon and participation in other high-level events.

Margreet van Vilsteren (Good fish foundation) said achievements but also downsides should also be presented (e.g. the current (e.g. the fact there are 2 vacant seats in the Excom among the « other interest groups » category).

12. Focus on Flemish aquaculture initiatives

The GA members listened to three presentations¹ about Flemish Aquaculture initiatives:

Karel Van Hulle, from the Department of agriculture and fisheries, Flemish government, presented the Belgian Aquaculture landscape, the Flemish Aquaculture platform and innovative Research projects in Flanders.

Edson Panana Villalobos, from the INAGRO Research Institute, presented aquaculture activities in his institution: Intensive culture of pikeperch in recirculating aquaculture systems, experiments to improve hatching rate, eggs, growth of different crops in aquaponics systems, etc.

Matthias Sandra & Fien De Raedemaecker, from the Flanders Marine Institute, presented the AQUA-LIT project, which aims at increasing the understanding, awareness and availability of solutions that tackle marine littering from aquaculture so a potential transformation towards a less polluting sector becomes possible.

13. Dissemination of AAC results

Bernhard Feneis (COGECA) read aloud the conclusions of the last International Carp Conference in Bavaria:

- There is an urgent need for legislative changes in the status of fish predators. Farmers should be allowed to protect these species and to protect their fish from these species.
- There should be compensation for the cost of environmental services done by farmers
- A 100% EU-funded promotion of carp is needed.
