MEETING MINUTES

Welcome words by the Chair Brian Thomsen

The **Chair Brian Thomsen** welcomed the Executive Committee (ExCom) members and confirmed the quorum.

1. Adoption of the agenda and last meeting's minutes (04 July 2023)

The agenda was adopted without change.

The minutes of the previous ExCom meeting (04.07.2023) were adopted without change.

2. Follow up on the decisions made at the meeting

The **Chair** reported on the follow-up on the decisions previously taken by the ExCom:

3. Working Groups (WG): Updates

Andrea Fabris (WG1 Chair) presented the work of WG1.

Paul Denekamp (WG2 Vice-Chair) presented the work of WG2.

Douglas Waley (WG3 Chair) presented the work of WG3.

4. Revision of the Status and Rules of Procedure (RoP)

Bruno Guillaumie (EMPA) and Javier Ojeda (FEAP) suggested some modifications to the draft status and RoP.

The Chair and Secretariat will update the drafts and send a revised version to the AAC members and to the EC for comments. The aim is to adopt the drafts at the next General Assembly.









5. External performance evaluation of the AAC

The Chair thanked the participants to the survey and reminded the ExCom that a meeting will be held on 10 November for the presentation of the main conclusions and discussions on next step

6. Proposal of compensation for Rapporteurs and Chairs

The Chair explained that his proposal to have an AAC policy for the compensation of Rapporteurs and Chairs had received comments from the Treasurer. As this proposal needed to be further discussed, the point will be on the agenda of the next meeting.

The members of the ExCom had several suggestions on the modalities of such a compensation, including the possibility of rising the travel expenses reimbursement levels for all AAC members or to organise common hotel bookings for AAC members. These points will be further discussed.

7. Common Aquaculture Policy

The ExCom discussed the necessity of pushing this issue to the European Parliament (EP) and new EC in 2024. A FG will be created in WG3 and Bruno Guillaumie (EMPA) will circulate a legal analysis document on establishing of a Common Aquaculture Policy.

8. AAC Budget 2022-2023: update on ongoing financial year

The Secretariat presented the 2022-2023 AAC progress budget.

With some budget remaining available, the ExCom approved to:

- Allow Aliénor to invoice an additional budget related to the secretariat services so as to cover inflation costs;
- Order new supplies of meetings material with the AAC logo as previous stocks have been depleted.

9. Renewal of AAC Secretariat contract

The Secretariat suggested to extend the contract's duration to 4 years (instead of 3) in order to align it with the duration of the new Lump Sum system.

The ExCom decided to revise Aliénor's contrat to:

- Extend it to 4 years (2023-2027);
- Adjust its yearly cost to a Belgian consumer inflation indicator (indice Santé).

10. Observers policy

The Secretariat informed the ExCom that the Norwegian Wellboat Association has requested the possibility of









becoming an observers (to receive the AAC WG agendas and attend the meetings). If they were to attend FG meetings, this would only be with the approval of the AAC members.

A discussion took place highlighting the fact that the AAC has an official open meetings policy and could therefore not prevent any association from joining as an observer. However, some members expressed concerns about having non-EU members accessing the information.

The Secretariat will draft an "active observer policy" to be published on the website. It will be submitted to the ExCom for written approval.

11. Updates by the Secretariat

- Participation to Aquaculture Europe

It is interesting but more oriented to scientists and networking, therefore there is no real purpose for the AAC to have a booth there.

- First meeting of the Joint Special Group – Marine Action Plan – 6 October

The AAC will be invited again to the next workshop and the invitation will be shared with AAC members.

There was little time for the ACs to take the floor. The ACs have decided to draft an official letter to be sent to the EC reminding that the ACs interventions needs to be given more importance than those of individual stakeholders.

- Inter-AC meeting – 10 October

Inter-AC meetings now tend to be more oriented towards policy discussions rather than focussing on the functioning of ACs. The only topic of interest for the AAC at this meeting was that DG Charlina Vitcheva stated that the EU seafood self-sufficiency could only be achieved by increasing aquaculture production.

Paul Denekamp (Vice-Chair), who was present during the Inter-AC meeting, reminded the ExCom that many animal welfare challenges remain to be solved before focusing on growth.

- Seminar DG MARE-Member States 18 October

Comments can be sent until 15 November to the Aquaculture Assistance Mechanism (AAM) team and the Secretariat will send an e-mail to inform AAC members.

Moreover, some relevant AAC Recommendations should have been listed in the reference documents that weren't. The Secretariat will contact the EC on this issue.

- Young Aquaculture Producers' visit to Brussels

The Secretariat informed the ExCom that young producers from Germany, Austria, Romania, Italy, Greece and France, both from finfish (inland and marine) and shellfish sectors, have attended this special day.

They met with the DG MARE team (including the EMFAF team), MEP Clara Aguilera (S&D – Spain – AAC Referent at PECH Committee) and attended a PECH Committee meeting. Some of them also attended the AAC WG meetings.

The ExCom suggested to carry on working with this group via a Young Aquaculture Producers consultation









group.

12. Any other business

Bruno Guillaumie (EMPA) requested that the issue of reinforcing the presence of AAC members within the MAC or discussing aquaculture market issues within the AAC is added on the next ExCom agenda.

13. Conclusions and closing of the meeting

The Chair thanked the ExCom members for a productive ExCom meeting.

The next ExCom meeting will take place virtually on the 5 December 2023.
