

### 3. Consumer information

#### **Draft recommendations**

- Access by consumers to information on CN code 16 products including: a) The commercial designation of the species and its scientific name, b) The production method (caught or farmed) and c) The area where the product was caught or farmed should be further facilitated.
- 2. The Commission is encouraged to consider the above in the planned legislative proposal for a framework for a sustainable food system, in the ongoing evaluation and potential revision of the CFP (CMO included), and in the planned legislative proposal for a revision of Regulation No 1169/2011 on the provision of food information to consumers.
- The Commission is asked to draft a guidance to retailers, mass caterers and Member States on how to distinguish between CN code 3 and Code 16 products. The guidance should also include options for how the information can be effectively communicated (i.e., posters, billboards, websites, apps). The guidance should take into account that the mass catering sector is mainly composed of SMEs and microenterprises.

- The aquaculture policy reform

Explicit mention of a split of views between "sector organisations" and "other interested stakeholders".

- The reform elements
- → Establish an Aquaculture Sustainability Regulation (ASR)

For aquaculture to contribute to the transition towards fairer and more sustainable EU food systems.

Including clear sustainability indicators (environmental, economic viability, social and animal welfare).

#### → Performance and Evaluation Framework (PMEF)

To overcome the current policy implementation failures by introducing a robust framework for monitoring progress and impact of the APR – Indicators and monitoring
